

<sup>\*\*</sup>A note on language: In this handout terms such as 'external genitalia/penis', 'front hole/bonus/vagina' and 'anus' are used to describe the different body parts. This is just so you know what is being discussed, as different communities can use similar words for quite different body parts - particularly in reference to genitals. When talking about yourself, or being referred to by others, we encourage you to use and request the language you feel most comfortable with instead! <sup>\*\*</sup> A note about lube: Proper lubrication is essential. Not enough lubrication can cause micro tears and other irritations that can increase your STI/STD risk. The ingredients of your lubrication also matter. Many contain added salts, sugars, and chemicals like propylene glycol - all of which can cause additional microtears, irritations, and stop your mucosal cells from functioning properly. Look for lubes without these harmful ingredients. In addition, there are several products that cater to specific needs such as hormonal changes, aging, allergies, etc. Lubricant is as personal as your fingerprint! Don't be afraid to keep searching for your perfect fit. One of our favorites is Aloe Cadabra - a lube specifically designed to help hydrate and lubricate for people who are going through hormonal shifts/changes.

<sup>\*\*</sup> The chances with condoms are based on the knowledge that sometimes condoms break, slip off, or are incorrectly used. If a condom is used perfectly, the chance will be lower. If the condom breaks or slips, the chances are the same as if the condom wasn't used. Also, condoms are less effective against infections that can be spread by skin to skin contact (syphilis, herpes, HPV).

<sup>\*\*</sup> The chances of HIV being passed can depend on viral load. For example, the chances are lower if your partner is on treatment for HIV and has an undetectable viral load.
