

# 2021 Annual Report

n many ways, the story for 2021 was more challenging than 2020. We lost more people to COVID in the first six months of 2021 than we did in the entire year of 2020, and with COVID making it unsafe to be indoors, fires making it unsafe to be outdoors, and civil unrest making it unsafe to be anywhere, there were few places where our transgender and gender diverse community members could be themselves.

AT OVER 70 DEATHS, 2021 WAS THE DEAD-LIEST YEAR FOR TRANS-RELATED VIO-LENCE IN THE US.

# Your Impact

However, the community stepped up and 2021 was also a phenomenal year of generosity and giving.

#### TRANSPONDER HAD OVER 90 NEW DO-NORS, WITH A TOTAL OF OVER \$20K IN DONATIONS AND OVER \$175K IN GRANTS!

Not just money was donated-you donated your stuff too! We've distributed over 150 used gender affirming products from our office, such as binders, bras, STP devices, packers, and breast forms. We couldn't have offered these items to community members without you.

And we wouldn't be where we are today without the help of our hard-working volunteers. We had nearly 100 active volunteers in 2021 who were able to show up for community members at events such as our

COVID vaccine clinics, World AIDS Day, and PRIDE in the Park. Volunteers also led essential resources, including our infobox and resource directory.

#### A Message From Our Board

In 2021 the board was dedicated to finding, hiring, and on-boarding a new Executive Director who would champion the next chapter of TransPonder's story. The board worked to create an inclusive hiring process that involved staff, volunteers, partners, advisors, consultants, and community members, helping inform us on what the right candidate looks like from the many different perspectives that work directly



with or are directly impacted by this role.

With much enthusiasm, in July we announced Kyle Rodriguez-Hudson as our new Executive Director.

Since then, we've been focused on on-boarding Kyle and working with him to increase capacity, which we've successfully done through increasing pay, offering healthcare benefits, hiring for new roles, and promotions.

In the year to come, the board will shift focus from expanding staff (as that is now being aptly handled by Kyle) to expanding the board and completing the transition from a working-board to a more traditional board of oversight and support.

2021 was just the beginning and the board is excited to continue working on building, expanding, and guiding this amazing organization as we move into 2022.











#### TEAM DEMOGRAPHICS







- People who received injection supplies: 81
- People who received financial assistance: 29


